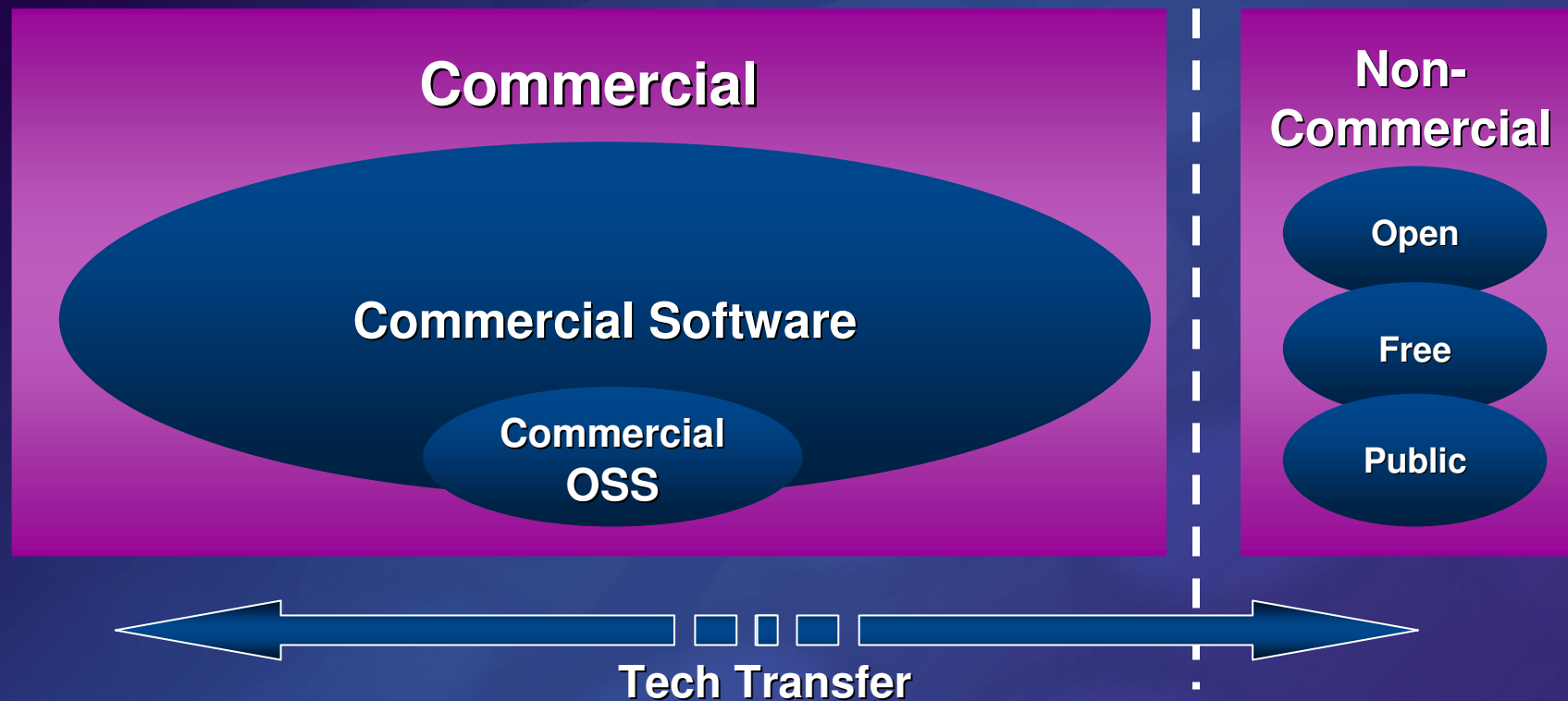

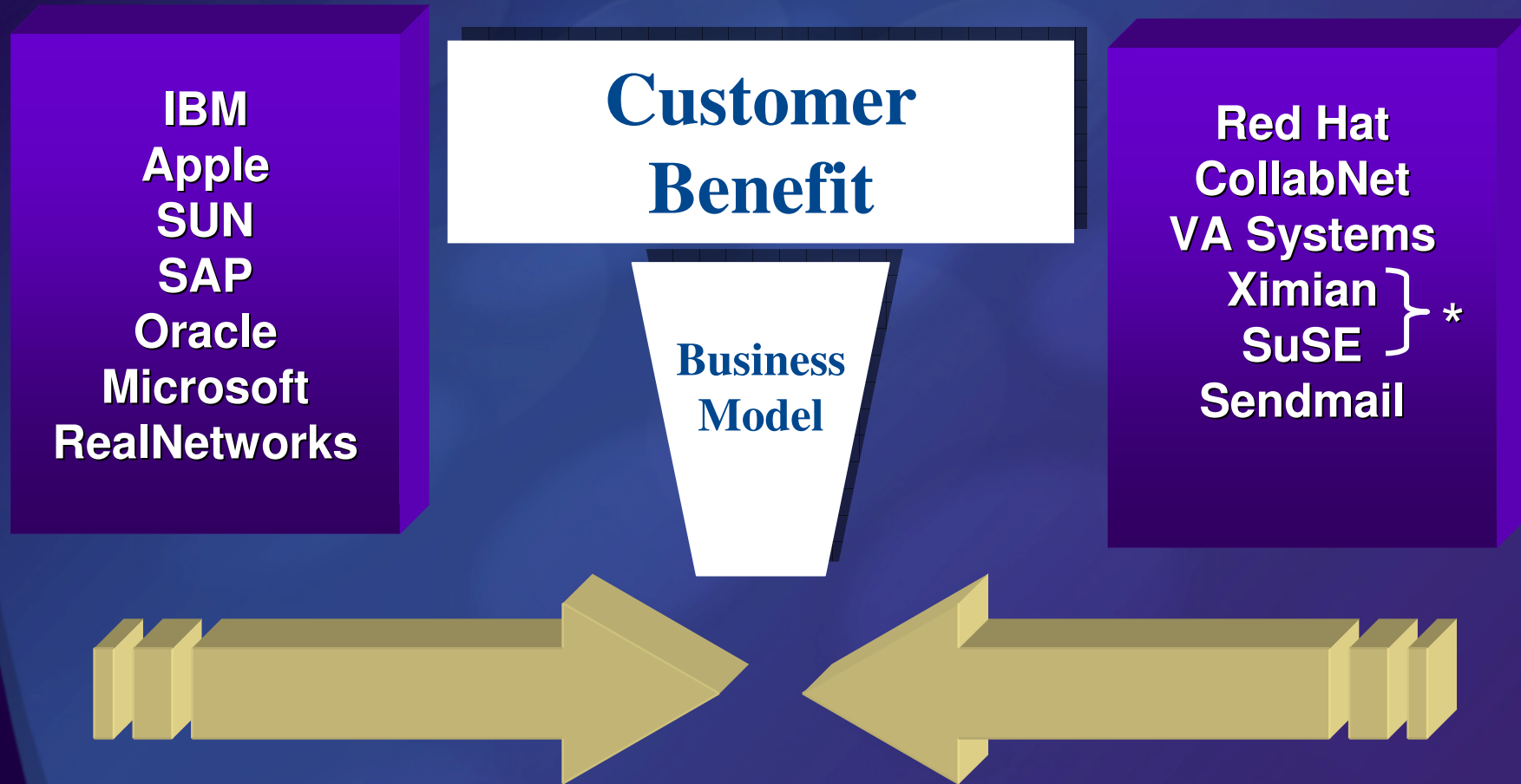


Commercial and Non-Commercial Software



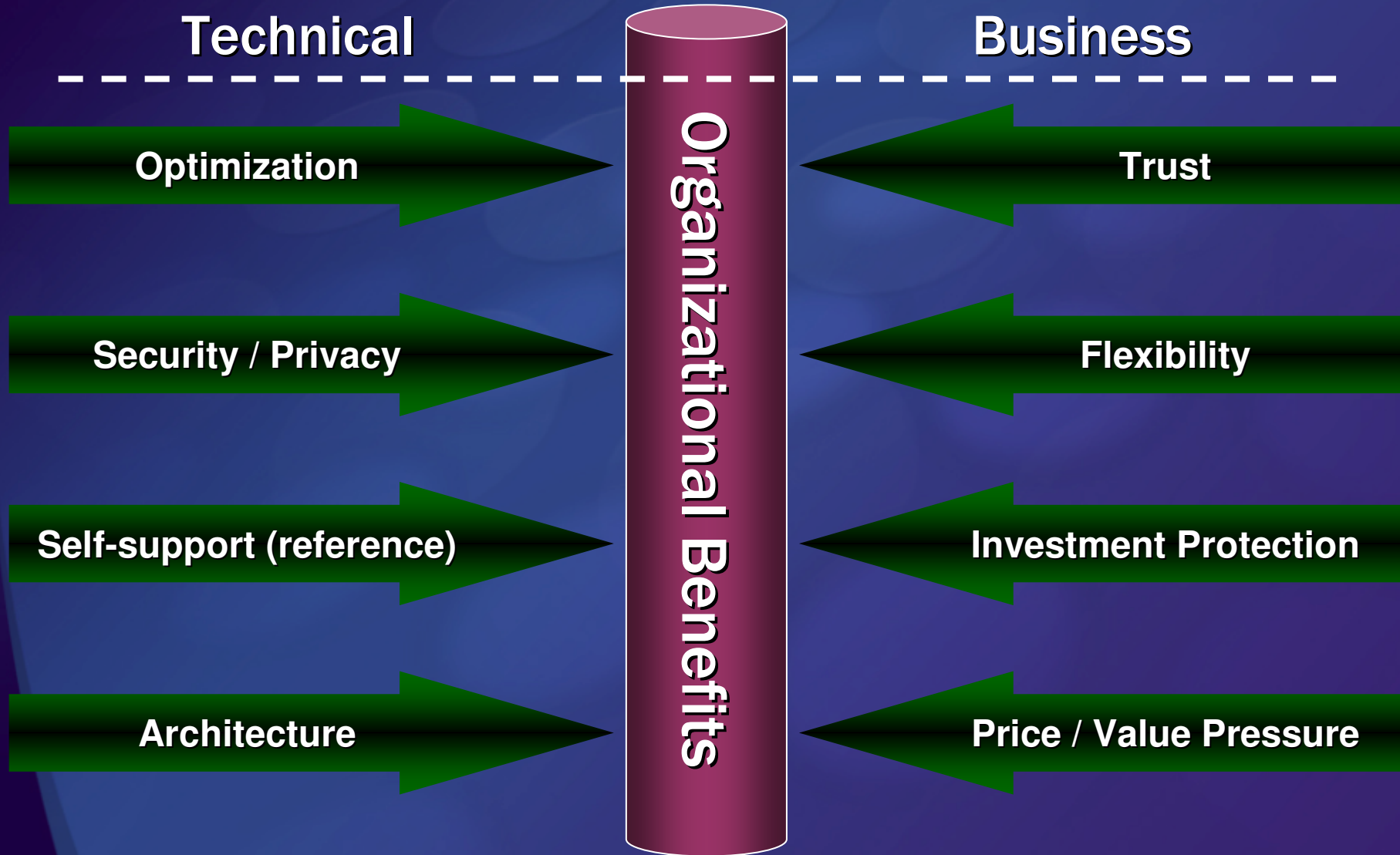
- >50K software companies producing >100K products

Industry Move To The Middle

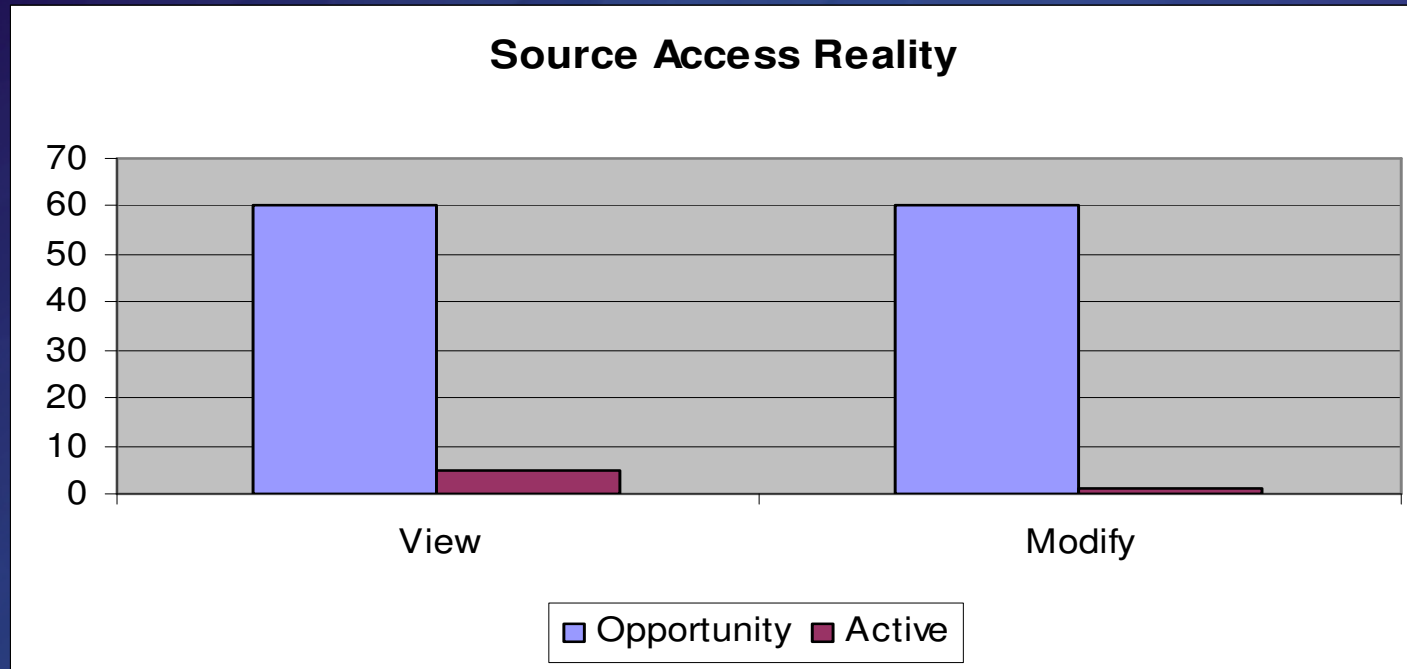

 - Australia, Austria, China, Finland, NATO, New Zealand, Norway, Russia, Spain, Switzerland, Taiwan, Turkey, UK
